ORDINANCE NO. 2023-38

An Ordinance of the Pierce County Council Repealing Chapter 9.12 of the Pierce County Code, "Attempted Suicide," Relating to the Misdemeanor Crime of Intending to Commit Suicide.

Whereas, Pierce County made attempted suicide a misdemeanor in 1967, which was recodified in 1984 to Section 9.12.010 of the Pierce County Code, "Penalty"; and

Whereas, attempted suicide was a felony under Washington State law until the statute was repealed in 1975; and

Whereas, the purpose of criminalizing attempted suicide was to take a person into custody to assure no further attempts, but that purpose no longer exists with the enactment of the Involuntary Treatment Act (Chapter 71.05 Revised Code of Washington), which provides a statutory framework for the civil investigation, evaluation, detention, and commitment of an individual where, as the result of a behavioral health disorder, presents an imminent likelihood of serious harm or is in imminent danger because of being gravely disabled, including threats or attempts to commit suicide; and

Whereas, in 2022 the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline implemented the 988 line to help those in immediate need. Individuals can call or text 988 if someone is experiencing a mental health or suicide-related crisis; Now Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of Pierce County:
