ORDINANCE NO. 2023-53

An Ordinance of the Pierce County Council Amending Section 13.13.085 of the Pierce County Code, "Rates and Charges," by Establishing the Year 2024 and Year 2025 Rates and Charges for the Availability and Furnishing of Sanitary Sewer Services; and Setting an Effective Date.

Whereas, pursuant to Chapter 36.94 of the Revised Code of Washington (RCW), Pierce County has full authority to establish, alter, regulate, and control rates and charges it imposes for the availability of sanitary sewer service; and

Whereas, Pierce County recognizes the need for proactive infrastructure planning and target investments as outlined in the Pierce County Government Economic Action Agenda, accepted under Resolution No. 2007-13; and

Whereas, it is the responsibility of the Sewer Division of the Planning and Public Works Department (PPW) to provide sanitary sewer services in a manner that is fiscally responsible and maintains stable and predictable rates and charges to ensure the long-term financial viability of the utility through adequate reserves and capital investment; and

Whereas, PPW currently provides sanitary sewer services to an estimated population of approximately 329,000 persons through approximately 71,000 residential and commercial accounts in the unincorporated urban areas of Pierce County and the Cities of Lakewood, University Place, DuPont, Edgewood, Milton, the Town of Steilacoom, and portions of the City of Tacoma and City of Fife; and

Whereas, the County public sewer system is comprised of the Chambers Creek Regional Wastewater Treatment Plant, Cascadia Wastewater Treatment Plant, approximately 740 miles of Utility-owned pipeline, 104 major pump stations, 766 residential grinder pump stations, and other components having an estimated asset replacement value of \$2.1 billion; and

Whereas, demand for sanitary sewer treatment services has increased steadily due to population growth since the establishment of the County Sewer Utility with historic monthly average wastewater flows increasing from approximately 5 million gallons per day in 1984 to approximately 21.4 million gallons per day in 2022 and has experienced peak month flows exceeding 42.2 million gallons per day; and



Whereas, based upon population growth forecasts produced by the Washington State Office of Financial Management, the demand for sewer service is expected to continue to increase, necessitating ongoing operation and reliability of wastewater infrastructure to meet the long-term needs of people and businesses in the service area; and

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Whereas, the wastewater industry requires highly specialized, certified engineering and technical operations staff with the necessary training and skills to manage complex treatment plant equipment and systems; and

Whereas, continued growth in the Cascadia wastewater basin necessitates additional staff to maintain an adequate level of service and reduce the probability of incidents leading to non-compliance as the treatment plant serving that area expands under Stages 4/5 of the Tehaleh community development; and

Whereas, the Sewer Division of PPW has identified a \$93 million biennium capital program necessary to take care of aging infrastructure, capacity improvements, operational efficiencies, and environmental preservation; and

Whereas, developing a robust preservation plan using condition-based data to reduce the risk of negative environmental and operational impacts necessitates an operational investment for the creation of a sewer system risk assessment and reduction program; and

Whereas, because a functioning sewer system with capacity for growth supports economic development and growth in Pierce County, it is necessary to increase the rates and charges imposed for the availability and furnishing of sanitary sewer services to keep pace with an expanding customer base and increasing maintenance, operations, and preservation costs.

Whereas, the Council finds that passage of this Ordinance is in the best interest of the County and its citizens; Now Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of Pierce County:

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Section 1. Section 13.13.085 of the Pierce County Code, "Rates and Charges," is hereby amended as shown in Exhibit A, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.
